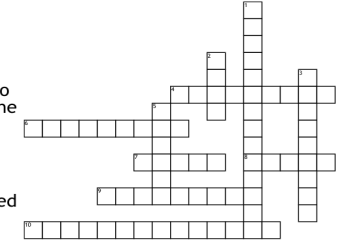
An Immigrant Prayer World Day of Migrants

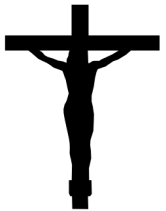

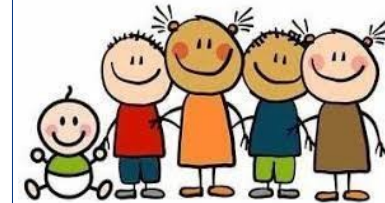
