## Children from Catholic backgrounds unaware of God

As our young people return to schools and colleges many families are concerned about school expenses ô fees, books, uniforms etc. Apart from the academic considerations, there is also the *'inner journey'* or spiritual journey that needs tending to. Recently, in his homily at Knock Shrine Bishop Christopher Jones expressed deep concern that faith in God is pushed from homes to the sidelines, and that some children from catholic backgrounds are unaware of God and unable even to make the sign of the Cross. In his homily, he also revealed that many of these children haven't learnt any prayers at home and never get to see the inside of a church. Since the arrival of the 1960s, faith and family life had experienced rapid social change and huge challenges. For so many people, God and faith in God were pushed from the centre of hearts and homes to the sidelines. ôOnce people give up on personal and family prayer and on the Sunday Mass, their faith becomes weakened and even dies.ô As we come towards the conclusion of -The Year of Faithø where do we stand in these matters in the parish of Drumlish/Ballinamuck? We need to take encouragement from the words to the Hebrews in today's second reading: *"So hold up you limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again."*
