

Vocation—Call to Priesthood

Below are two extracts from homilies given earlier this year by Archbishop Michael Neary and Bishop Francis Duffy at the ordination of two new priests in their respective dioceses. As we listen to Jeremiah and St. Mark in this Sundays Word of God, coupled with the recent Diocesan changes, we should not be too despondent but be people of hope and confidence.

"An old African proverb states "It takes a village to rear a child". Vocations are born in families where love and self-denial are the fabric of daily life, where there is gentleness, compassion, willingness to forgive, a concern for justice and an openness to God's call. In many respects the vocational call to priesthood is profoundly countercultural because the primary dominating voices today stress doing one's own thing. We felt drawn to God. Every priest will tell you that we have done nothing to deserve this call. Nobody has a right to it. We are dependent on the support, encouragement and prayers of so many people on our journey." Archbishop Michael Neary

"In many ways answering God's call is counter cultural. For some God is an irrelevance, for some an irritant and for others an invention. For those who have faith, God is the centre of all things. Answering God's call, no matter what path we take in life, is something very natural for a believer, challenging and attractive, risky and rewarding, but fully within what it is to be a Christian. It is a great time to be a Catholic priest in Ireland. One feature of following the Lord is willingness to be surprised by him. Willingness to be brought down unfamiliar paths, and being open to finding God in the most unlikely places." Bishop Francis Duffy
