Holy Year of Mercy

Earlier this year Pope Francis announced a Jubilee Year of Mercy as follows: 'I have decided to announce an Extraordinary Jubilee which has at its centre the mercy of God. It will be a Holy Year of



Mercy. We want to live in the light of the word of the Lord: "Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful" (cf. Lk 6:36).

This Holy Year which began on the feast of the Immaculate Conception, will conclude on Sunday, 20 November 2016, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King, the living face of the Father's mercy.' The logo and the motto together provide a fitting summary of what the Jubilee

Year is all about. The motto Merciful Like the Father (Luke, 6:36) serves as an invitation to follow the merciful example of the Father who asks us not to judge or condemn but to forgive and to give love and forgiveness without measure. The logo represents an image of the Son having taken upon his shoulders the lost soul demonstrating that it is the love of Christ that brings to completion the mystery of his incarnation culminating in redemption. One particular feature worthy of note is that while the Good Shepherd, in his great mercy, takes humanity upon himself, his eyes are merged with those of man. Christ sees with the eyes of Adam, and Adam with the eyes of Christ.

Misery Dinner

Author Leo Buscaglia tells this story about his mother and their "misery dinner." It was the night after his father came home and said it looked as if he would have to go into bankruptcy because his partner had absconded with their firm's funds. His mother went out and sold some jewellery to buy food for a sumptuous feast. Other members of the family scolded her for it. But she told them that "the time for joy is now, when we need it most, not next week." Her courageous act rallied the family.
