Vocations Sunday

Today is vocations Sunday. While acknowledging the serious damage done to priesthood over the recent years because of the 'abuse' scandals, it would be wrong to dismiss the role of the priest as mediator and shepherd in the 'new Ireland' of today. We all need to hear of God's love and of his invitation to share in that love and to be embraced by that love. The following extract, written by Fr. Tom Clancy, is taken from Intercom, published by Veritas.

Vocations Sunday: God's call to each person is individual. Some He invites to lay life. Others He calls to priesthood and religious life. The temptation is to grade and compare these invitations. Comparison destroys the appreciation of uniqueness. Today, we can focus on those called to priesthood. At a time when there is much social change and much questioning of the role of the priest in present day society, it is valuable to focus on a core role of the priest today. Priesthood is a gift of God to his people to enable us, as a community, to share fully in the Eucharist and through it to grow in an awareness of God's presence in every aspect of our lives. It is not given for the priest himself, but is a gift given for all through one individual. The world sees such a call as foolhardy and futile. To a person of faith, the call is one of love and mutual trust. We pray that God's call may be answered in many hearts this year.
