Vocations Sunday

Today is Vocations Sunday. We refer you again to the recent pastoral letter from Bishop Francis Duffy about the critical shortage of priests over the next ten years. In a society, where our Catholic faith and traditions are continually mocked and undermined by a hostile media, aided and abeted by our political system in pursuance of a more secular state, the call to priesthood is ever more challenging. It makes sense only in the context of faith in Jesus Christ, the promise of redemption and the Easter mystery. "Behind and before every vocation to the priesthood or to the consecrated life there is always the strong and intense prayer of someone: a grandmother, a grandfather, a mother, a father, a community.... This is why Jesus said: "Pray therefore the Lord of the harvest," that is. God the Father, "to send out labourers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38). Vocations are born in prayer and from prayer; and only through prayer can they persevere and bear fruit." [Pope Francis1
