

Mission Sunday

Today, Mission Sunday, Catholics all over the world have an opportunity to sow seeds of faith that are watered and nurtured throughout the year by World Missions Ireland, the Pope's official charity for overseas mission. Through prayer and giving we can stand in solidarity with all our brothers and sisters overseas. Did you know that 40% of the Church around the world is missionary? That's thousands of parishes which are too young or poor to support themselves. By sharing what we have with those in need we help build a worldwide Church which can reach out to people with the Gospel. Those who have never heard the message of Jesus are given the chance to experience the love of Christ and to know the support of our Church family. Today, on Mission Sunday, every person in every parish in every country where the Church is present, will be celebrating together and sharing what they have, no matter how little. It is the one Sunday in the year when Mass is celebrated exclusively for missionary activity.

Tax Reclaim

All tax reclaim forms which were issued last month should be completed and returned to the parish at this time. If you are a PAYE or Self Assessed and you have contributed €250 or more in Offertory and Dues for the year 2016, the parish, as a charitable institution can reclaim the tax you have paid at source. If you didn't get a letter, but think you fill that criterion, check with Fr. Ber and we can arrange to have a form sent out to you. Its important revenue for the parish.

Return the Cross to Golgotha

*I simply argue that the cross be raised again at the centre of the marketplace as well as on the steeple of the church.
I am recovering the claim that Jesus was not crucified in a cathedral between two candles;
But on a cross between two thieves:
on a town garbage heap;
at a crossroad of politics so cosmopolitan that they had to write His title in Hebrew and in Latin and in Greek.
And at the kind of place where cynics talk smut, and thieves curse and soldiers gamble.
Because that is where He died, and that is what He died about.
And that is where Christ's men ought to be, and what church people ought to be about.*
