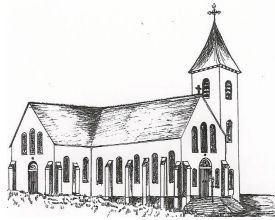
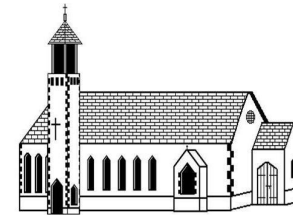

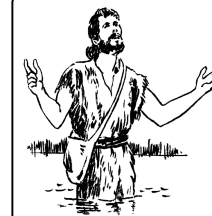
## His Way Was Right
