

Root System Is Trust

The tree can be an apt image of our spiritual life, our journey to God. Every growth upward and outward necessitates a deepening and widening of the roots. Some species of deciduous trees have one root, the tap root, which extends downward to stabilize the tree at the centre and to reach the deepest source of water.
