Because of the requirements that indoor gatherings of more than 100 people be avoided, and the difficulties that may arise in achieving this, and always mindful of public safety and those with underlying medical conditions, the following arrangements are to be followed in all parishes:

Diocesan Regulations Updates

- Because of the emergency situation, all parishioners are dispensed from the obligation to physically attend Sunday Mass.
- During the period 13th March to 29th March the public celebration of Mass on weekdays and at weekends is suspended with immediate effect. This includes St. Patrick's Day.
- Be assured that priests will continue to celebrate Mass privately and pray for the needs of their parishioners.
- Mass will be available by webcam at St. Mel's Cathedral www.longfordparish.com each day 8am, 10am, 1.05 weekdays, 7.30 pm Saturday, and 8am, 10am, 11.30am, and 1.00 pm Sundays.
- All non-essential pastoral gatherings and meetings, such as formation gatherings, retreats and seminars are cancelled.
- & All Confirmations are postponed until further notice.
- Every Catholic is entitled to a dignified Christian burial. Attendance at Funeral services and Masses should be limited to close relatives and must not exceed 100 attendees within the Church building.
- Similarly, Church weddings and baptisms may be celebrated on condition that the attendance in Church does not exceed 100 people.
- In these difficult and uncertain times, people find strength, consolation and hope in prayer. Churches should remain open for práver each day.

Supporting Trócaire 2020



Moses, in today's reading, is told to take off his shoes for the ground on which he walks is "holy ground". Again on Trócaire's Lenten Campaign this year. we are reminded of land-rights. There remains much injustice in our world. Much of Trócaire's work seems to be

linked with being on the side of right rather than might. The people working for Trócaire abroad are, in most cases, local people who have no stomach for oppression and want to make a difference in their own place. The work done by Trócaire here in Ireland and abroad is crucial. When Pope St. John Paul kissed the ground of Ireland, (Sept. 1979) he made a statement around respect. He knew that he would be here for a limited amount of time but wanted the people of Ireland, like Moses, to recognise the holiness of the ground on which they walked and to leave the world a better place, but in no way damaged, because we lived. Supporting Trócaire enables people in war torn and drought torn parts of the world overcome challenges that we could not ever imagine.
