Instructions relating to Phase Two concerning Baptisms, Marriages and Funerals (Phase 2 extends from 8th June 2020)

From 8th June 2020 the following are the permitted:

- **Baptisms** with no more than 6 people present in the church and adhering to social distancing and with cleaning and sanitizing of area before and after ceremony.
- Weddings with no more than 6 people present in the church and adhering to social distancing and with cleaning and sanitizing of area before and after ceremony.
- Funerals: Up to 25 people may attend a funeral mass while adhering to social distancing and with cleaning and sanitizing of the area before and after ceremony.

I ask the families concerned with their particular ceremony to insure the cleaning and sanitizing of the areas in use. Full details of regulations are posted on notice boards. Note: all of the above refer to Phase 2 and may be adjusted at the end of Phase 2. Thank you.

Regulations re: Return to Mass

The following steps should be undertaken in each parish to ensure that the preparations in each church are efficiently and effectively planned.

- Establish a Covid-19 Support Team of parishioners to organise preparations and to oversee their implementation and verification.
- Identify volunteers to assist with the implementation and verification.
- Provide appropriate induction and training where necessary to priests, ministers, readers, and volunteers.
- Secure an appropriate supply of signage, cleaning/ sanitising materials and accessories and items necessary for protection.

I am asking for volunteers who will help put into action the above steps. Please contact me by text on 0868213422 before the end of next week. Please note that the return of public celebration of Mass depends on having an effective support team. If we are unable to meet these requirements, public celebration of Mass will have to be deferred to later. Thank you.

The Feast of the Body & Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Corpus Christi is a feast day that celebrates the belief and the tradition of the transubstantiation of Christ's body and blood to bread and wine in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. This solemnity is celebrated in many different countries around the world and is celebrated about two months after Easter.

Saint Juliana of Liege (1193-1258), who had a great reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, began the cause for the feast day of Corpus Christi. She thought that the Eucharist deserved its own exclusive day of reverence and recognition. This day would be apart from Holy Thursday when the Church focuses on not only the Eucharist but the washing of the feet, ordained priesthood, and Jesus in agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. She worked more than 40 years for the cause until her death. In her later years, she gained the support of Jacques Pantaléon, at the time Archdeacon of Liège, and other Church leaders. Pantaléon was later elected Pope Urban IV and went on to establish the Feast of Corpus Christi.
