### Guidelines to the public Celebration of Mass

Those attending Mass in Drumlish/Ballinamuck are asked to sign in, using the book provided at the main entrance. This is to insure traceability in the event of anyone contracting the Covid-19 virus. When attending Mass, please observe the following guidelines:

- Wash your hands before and after attending Mass
- Sanitise your hands as you enter and leave Church
- Observe social distancing, as marked
- Wearing a face cover/mask is recommended
- · Enter by main door and Exit by side doors
- Offerings/Envelopes should be placed in the basket in front of altar at end of Mass on exiting.
- When receiving Holy Communion, please come seat by seat, starting at the front and returning by the side passages, while observing social distance. All receive Communion on the hands.
- Thank you for your cooperation and keep safe.

*Note: in view of recent regulations, particularly* relating to 'subdivisions' it is not possible for now to increase the capacity of our two churches in Drumlish & Ballinamuck beyond the number 50.

Confirmation





## **Reflections of todays Readings**

Him be your "daily bread"?

In today's readings, we celebrate the great love of God, who not only gives us life, but desires to sustain and nourish us generously too.

In the First Reading, it is God himself who urgently pleads with his troubled, scattered people to listen. Through his prophet, he issues an invitation to a sacred meal. God offers 'water' for thirsty souls: 'corn, wine and milk' will also be made freely available for hungry hearts, without charge.

In the Psalm, one traditionally sung at meals, we praise the God who cares for all his creatures, supplying them with nourishment.

Paul writes in very stirring language, assuring us of the ever-present love and power of Jesus Christ. Divine love gives us grace and encouragement to live life to the fullest, even with and through the unavoidable trials and sufferings of life. This is the Christian gospel, the Good News! (Second Reading)

Even whilst stricken with grief, Jesus's response to the people is one of compassion (Gospel). He heals the sick and feeds the hungry, and there is still plenty of food left over to share. Jesus feeds the crowd in a way that foresees the food and drink he will offer us in the Eucharist.

Let's pray this week for courage to take the risk of really hearing what God is saving to us: what sacred nourishment he is freely offering us.

May we put ourselves into his hands, asking that he will deepen his life in us and in our anxious, unjust world. [Jesuit Ministries]
