

Guidelines to the public Celebration of Mass

Those attending Mass in Drumlish/Ballinamuck are asked to sign in, using the book provided at the main entrance. This is to insure traceability in the event of anyone contracting the Covid-19 virus. When attending Mass, please observe the following guidelines:

- Wash your hands before and after attending Mass
- Sanitise your hands as you enter and leave Church
- Observe social distancing, as marked
- Wearing a face cover/mask is recommended
- Enter by main door and Exit by side doors
- Offerings/Envelopes should be placed in the basket in front of altar at end of Mass on exiting.
- When receiving Holy Communion, please come seat by seat, starting at the front and returning by the side passages, while observing social distance. All receive Communion on the hands.



The Deep End—A Woman of Faith

Today's gospel recounts an unusual exchange between Jesus and the unnamed Canaanite woman who challenges him. She has seen what Jesus can do. she has faith, and she is advocating for her daughter. She is persistent, shouting out to Jesus and apparently also badgering the disciples, to the point where they plead with Jesus to 'give her what she wants.' It's a strange story, with Jesus at first appearing cold in his response to the woman. But as we know, he has a tendency to test his followers. Jesus can see that she is a person of strong faith. clever and determined. Jesus does not want us to be silent, compliant or complacent. He rejoices in those who are brave and persistent, and eager to challenge the injustices they see around them – those who have the gift of changing minds and hearts. We might call it the gift of prophecy.
