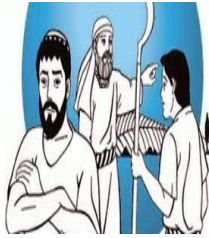

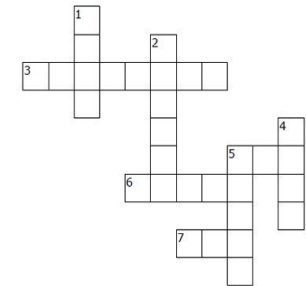
October—Mission Month
