**October—Month of the Rosary**

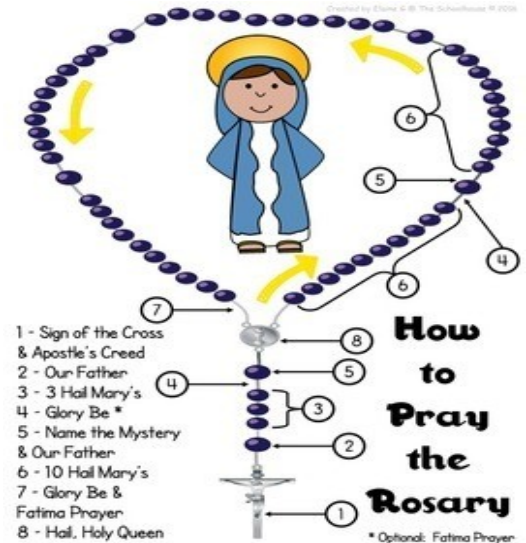
It is also the month of the Rosary. During this Covid-19 pandemic why not rediscover the Rosary beads and pray for help, for guidance and for protection. Down through the centuries at times of plagues and pestilence the people turned to God. Surely we are humble enough and our faith is still strong enough to seek God’s help.

The Rosary developed a parallel with the Monastic Office with the 150 psalms mirroring the 150 Hail Marys of the Rosary cycle. The cycle outlines the history of salvation from the announcement of Christ's birth to Mary's coronation in heaven. Many religions use beads to quiet the mind. The repetition of prayers and the handling of the beads create a space to allowing the Spirit to whisper to our hearts the wonder and mystery of God's love for us.



October invites us to recover a renewed appreciation of the rosary as a contemplative and Christ-centered prayer. In this Mission Month we pray especially for all missionaries, peace keeping soldiers, development workers and NGO's who are serving overseas.
