



Covid-19 Public Regulations Update

The following are the implications for Church practice in line with Government regulations relating to Level 3 Covid-19:

- * Public Masses cannot be celebrated from midnight 6th October 2020.
- * The following exceptions are allowed:
 (a) Funeral Masses with up to 25 mourners.
- (b) Marriages with up to 25 guests.
- * Churches may remain open for private prayer, with adequate sanitising measures.

The public health guidelines mention 25 mourners at funerals and 25 guests at marriages, these figures do not include the priest, sacristan, ushers etc. they are in addition to the twenty five persons allowed. Details on Level Three are to be found at ww.gov.ie

Sacraments 2021

In 2021 the Sacrament of Confirmation will be administered by the parish priest, following the norms and regulations in operation at the time. In parishes where Confirmation is held every second year it may be worth considering having the sacrament for pupils of sixth class only. It is important for all involved to be aware that ceremonies may have to be postponed at short notice. [Bishop's Office]

We are especially mindful in 2020 of those grieving families, who, because of restrictions, have been unable to experience the customary spiritual and community supports which are so much part of our Irish tradition.

Conditions for Indulgences

- From 12 o'clock on 1 November until midnight on 2 Nov., all who have a) confessed, b) received Communion c) prayed for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one plenary indulgence applicable only to the souls of the departed by visiting a church or oratory and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed.
- From 1 8 November the faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence once per day applicable only to the Holy Souls. Conditions a, b, c, above apply also.
