Worship in December 2020

A special concession has been made for Places of Worship to reopen for religious services at Level 3, from 1st December, in light of the upcoming Christmas period, to be reviewed in January. Mass:

IVIASS:

- The number of people who can gather in any church is governed by the following 2 criteria:
- 2 meter distance must be maintained between each individual/household group.
- The maximum number of people allowed to gather in an indoor setting is 50.
- Worshippers are advised to wear face masks

Please also note the following:

- Household group individuals must be counted to ensure you are not exceeding the maximum number in an indoor setting (50).
- Please be aware that some concerns have been expressed about social distancing as people enter and leave churches; this may necessitate staggering movement in and out.
- Congregating outside the church is discouraged.

Funerals, Weddings etc:

- Funerals and Weddings: Numbers permitted at funerals and weddings remain at 25.
- Baptisms: Baptisms may take place with a maximum of 10 being present. Social distancing & sanitising to be observed.
- **Confessions**: The Sacrament of Penance may take place, in a safe manner, while observing all the sanitising and protection procedures.
- Choirs Guidance from the HSE is awaited. It is expected that choirs will not be allowed and that an instrumentalist and a cantor may perform. Diocese of Ardagh & Clonmacnois 3rd December 2020
