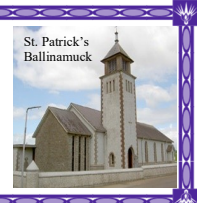

Angelus Bell on Radio

Every now and then there is an argument about the broadcasting of the Angelus bell on RTÉ. The bell was first broadcast on Radio Éireann, as it was called, at 6.00 pm on 15 August 1950. It marked the Holy Year and the possibility of a spoken Angelus or a recording of the bell had been raised. The option of a 'live' bell was explored. The only electric operated bell in Dublin was in the Merchant's Quay church but only with a manual push button. Archbishop John Charles McQuaid made his preference for the Pro-Cathedral known and work began to make this possible with the installation of automation and a fool-proof clock system, with a master clock in the GPO, controlled from Dunsink observatory. The Archbishop gave instruction for a 3-3-3-9 sequence, with the first stroke at 6.00 pm precisely. The midday bell was not broadcasted as Radio Éireann was not on air at that time.



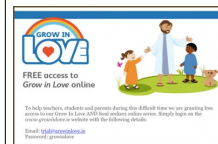
Vox Dei—the Voice of God!

- ♦ **Weddings:** With effect from Sunday 3rd January 2021 the number of guests permitted to attend is reduced to 6.
