New Covid-19 Regulations From 6th September

- From September 6th the number of participants at religious ceremonies will be 50% of the church's capacity. For both Ballinamuck and Drumlish that means that the number permitted has increased to **130 persons**.
- **Weddings:** The number of guests at a wedding remains at 100 during September
- Communion is to be received on the hand
- **Note:** If or when inviting family members to your celebrations be aware that the capacity for our churches is 130 persons i.e. 50% of total capacity. Personal responsibility should be exercised re: social distancing. Wearing of face masks and sanitising remain in force.

Keeping Safe & Protecting Others

Because the restrictive barriers on the church seats have been taken down, it is essential that all people attending church services will adhere to these FOUR safety regulations re: Covid-19:

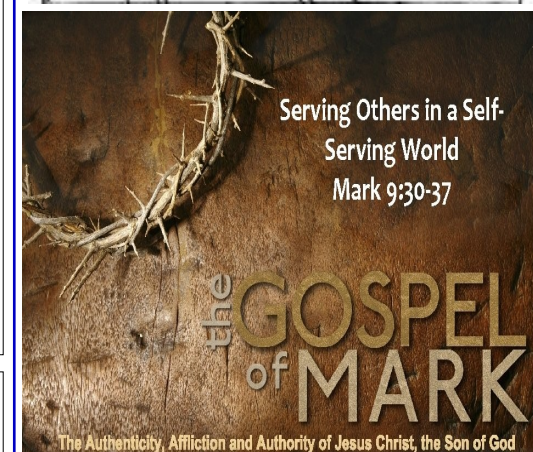
1. **Wear your face mask inside the church**
