

The Gospel Challenge

Both the Prophet Jeremiah and St. Luke's Gospel, (today's readings) envision our experience of church and faith in Ireland and Europe today. The Gospel message is challenging and to be a prophetic voice for that message may lead to rejection, ridicule, suffering and even martyrdom. Questions raised include: First, do you ignore or try to silence those prophets who are calling for change — change within ourselves, our communities, or even in the Church? Are you willing to risk dialogue and even conversion, as we are invited to reflect not only on what is possible, but on what might be essential? This can become especially difficult for us when we are being asked to reconsider beliefs, customs, or practices that are near and dear to us. Second, are you willing to live out your call to be a prophet yourself? Where are the injustices or abuses that need to be named? What wrongs need to be made right? What wounds need to be healed? While we are called to pray for peace, we are also called, by virtue of our baptism, to adopt a prophetic stance and call for change — for conversion — where change is needed. This also means that we have to be courageous enough to stand alone, at times. As we continue our journey through Ordinary Time, reflecting on the demands of our discipleship and what it means to truly live the faith we profess, recall the words of Saint Catherine of Siena, "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire."
