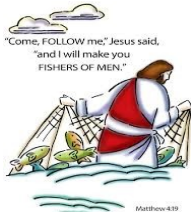

yet we are one in Christ.

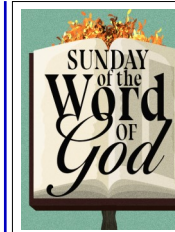
Butchers, bakers,
