Today we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent, beginning of a new Liturgical year. For those who follow your Sunday/Weekday Missal, the readings for the new Liturgical year are Cycle B Sundays and Cycle 2 weekdays.

The Advent Wreath, with the four candles lit on consecutive Sundays is a recollection of the various stages of salvation history prior to Christ's coming and a symbol of the prophetic light gradually illuminating the long night prior to the rising of the Sun of Justice (Christ, the Lord).
