

Saints of the Week

- +Monday: St. Mary Magdalene who stood by the Cross of Jesus; with two other women she discovered the empty tomb; she was granted an appearance of the Risen Lord early the same day.
- +Tuesday: St. Bridget of Sweden, Born in 1303, she brought up eight children, and after the death of her husband she founded the Bridgettine Order and lived in Rome where she died in 1373. She was declared a patron of Europe in 2000.
- +Wednesday: St. Declan. He was of noble blood. Colman, a local priest, baptised him. Later he went to Europe where he was ordained priest and possibly bishop. He settled in Ardmore where he evangelised the Decies country.
- +Thursday: St. James, Apostle, son of Zebedee and brother of John. He was put to death by Herod about the year 44, being the first of the Apostles to die for Christ. His shrine is at Compostela in Spain.
- +Friday: Ss. Joachim & Anne, parents of the BVM, grandparents of the Lord. St. Anne is patron of Canada, women in labour, miners and homemakers.
