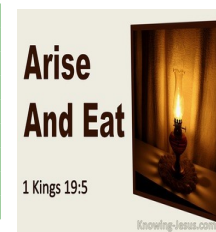

There is a real temptation for all of us, when we are depressed or burnt out, to stop engaging with church, to stop coming

to church. But notice what the angel says to Elijah: "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you". The emphasis is still on Elijah's recuperation but, this time, there is mention of a journey. God is gently introducing to Elijah hope and promise for the future. This hope and promise is offered to each of us today, especially in these days when our church is going through a dark time.
