

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Jubilee Year—Pilgrims of Hope



The Jubilee has its origins in an ancient biblical tradition (Leviticus). Every 50th year was celebrated as a time for setting slaves free, for forgiving debts, and for allowing the land to rest. In our Christian tradition the Jubilee has a

strong focus on reconciliation and renewal, including reaching out to people on the margins. At the same time, during Jubilee 2025, the Irish Synodal Pathway will also journey with the theme of 'Hope' at its many meetings and prayerful discernment gatherings which will lead to a national assembly in Ireland in 2025. To celebrate the Jubilee year the Parish will have a short Parish Mission from the evening of Saturday 10th May to Tuesday evening, 13th May.

World Day of Prayer for Peace

Forgive us our trespasses; grant us your peace. Forgive us for the war, Lord.

Lord Jesus, son of God, have mercy on us sinners. Lord Jesus, born under bombs, have mercy on us. Lord Jesus, dead in the arms of a mother, have mercy on us.
