Mandatory Safeguarding Training

Lyn McDermott, of the National Safeguarding Board will cover the full child safeguarding training to all Clergy, Sacristans, Leaders of Youth Choir, of Pray & Play, Ministers of Eucharist to the Housebound. etc. In other words all persons volunteering in church activities with children are requested to attend. The session will last 3 hours from 6.30pm to 9.30pm, tea/coffee on arrival, and will amalgamate an information session, refresher and the full training in one. Once completed this training is good for 3 years. Training/Refresher course will take place in Longford Deanery as follows: Thursday, 24th July in Temperance Hall, Longford, N39 R9X8 from 6.30 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. Note: this is mandatory and in keeping with best practice.
