

How is Mission Sunday collection used? In essence, Mission Sunday

- provides Church-centred infrastructure by helping communities build churches, schools and clinics;
- prepares the future leaders and carers of the Church by supporting the training of sisters, priests, religious brothers and catechists;
- supports missionary programmes that protect and care for children's well-being by offering safe shelter, healthcare, education and hope for the future.



Mission Sunday



World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue. The theme for this year's celebration of Mission Sunday is:

"Missionaries of Hope

Among All Peoples".

The motto "Missionaries of Hope Among all Peoples" highlights the Church's vocation to be messengers of hope, following Christ's example. Christ is portrayed as the ultimate source of hope, having experienced human suffering and despair, yet remaining obedient to God's plan. The Church, as a community of Christ's disciples, continues this mission, offering hope and healing to those in need, despite facing challenges and imperfections. Christians are called to share the Good News by engaging with the life situations of others, particularly the marginalized. The hope offered by the Church transcends worldly concerns. aiming for a divine communion with God. fulfilling both temporal and eternal needs. Disciples are urged to become "artisans" of hope, drawing strength from the Eucharist and the Easter spirituality that celebrates Christ's resurrection. Prayer is highlighted as essential for sustaining hope and is considered the primary missionary activity. Evangelization is a communal process, requiring ongoing support and formation within Christian communities. emphasizing the importance of synodality and active participation in the Church's mission.
