Pope Francis often speaks of the church as a field hospital. It is a very helpful image to think of our church as such. Pope Francis was thinking of the hospitals that are set up in the vicinity of a war zone where the wounded come to have their wounds tended to. It is a portrayal of the church that reflects the ministry of Jesus. Jesus tended to the wounded in body, mind and spirit. Jesus proclaims the presence of the kingdom of God by attending to other people's needs. He has compassion on the crowds who come to him and seem harassed and dejected like sheep without a shepherd. There will be times when we will be the ones coming in with our wounds; there will be times when we will be sent out as disciples to bring his healing presence to others who are wounded. We are always wounded healers!

the truth they once heard!*

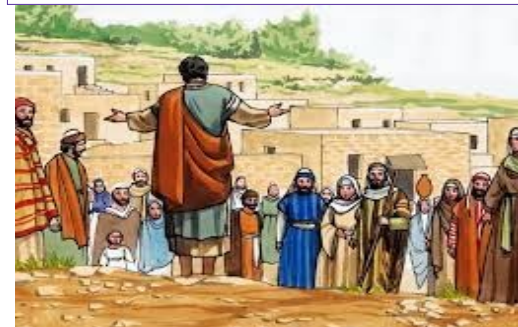
