

This year, due to the Covid-19 restrictions I am asking parishioners to collect their Trócaire packet (which contains the Trócaire Box) from the back of the Church as there is no other means of distribution. Also please take one for your neighbour(s) who are not out and about. Thank you.

Level 5 Covid-19 Government Regulations
