#### Notes of Explanation

- ☑ This statement for the Drumlish/Ballinamuck Parish Accounts reflects the day to day running of the Parish. [Insurances, Maintenance, Heating & Lighting, and Levies to the Diocese etc.].
- Income v Expenses for the past year left us with a running surplus of €191,672.37. This figure reflects the sale of the Parochial House in Ballinamuck which, including auctioneer and legal fees, brought in a net total of €154,404.57.
- Image: The Parish also has a fixed term deposit in TSB of €23,645.01 which, combined with the above balance leaves the parish with total assets of €390,029.74
- ✓ \*\*Sundry expenses include Webcam Streaming €1,440, Printer Copier €1,460, Dromard Development Association €600.00 (Benefiting Drumlish & Ballinamuck) and numerous smaller items.
- While accepting that these are financially difficult times for all, nevertheless I ask all families and individuals who use the services of the clergy and/or parish facilities, but for some reason have overlooked the support of the parish and its priests to reflect on this in 2023. Young families also have duty of care for their parish and their priests.
- ✓ With a decreasing paying public, the decreasing purchasing value of the euro and the continuing rising costs re: maintenance, heating and lighting putting €2 in the envelope this day and age will not keep the lights on in our churches, much less the heating and maintenance. The minimum contribution to the offertory collection should be <u>no less</u> than €5.
- $\square$  The Six Dues Collections for the upkeep of the priests for 2022 totalled €28,456. Alternative dues envelopes are provided at the back of the churches for those who don't use the normal envelope system, but still wish to support the clergy of the parish.
- Note: Church Gate collections are not the Parish responsibility. They are independent of the Parish but should have a Garda Permit. All Church Gate collections are accountable to their own organisations and regulations. We ask again that such collections should be taken up at a reasonable distance from the Church gate entrance—preferably on the opposite side of the Church gate entrance.
- On behalf of the Parish Finance Committee, I thank all who continue to generously support our parish and clergy. Thanks also to all the various voluntary individuals and groups who give of their time, energy and support enabling our parish to function effectively at a time when the 'cancel culture' of today pushes in a different direction.
