

#### Stop for a While

(A Story to Ponder)

Two monks were asked by their abbot to harvest wheat in the field. Using their sickles, the two monks started to hack the stalks and gather them into bundles. The first monk worked without pause while the second monk would stop every hour.

At the day's end, the second monk had more bundles of wheat than the first monk who worked without pause.

The first monk was surprised by the result and questioned his confrere, "I worked without stopping and yet you have harvested more wheat even though you rested each hour. Tell me, how did you do it?" "Whenever I stopped, I sharpened my sickle."

#### Reflection

What we receive in the small piece of bread or the sip of wine at the Eucharist is the gift of life from Jesus. This is a sharing in the life of God; in the fragility of the bread and wine is strong food, and joyful drink fruit of God's creation and work of human hands. It is the gift of God who has become one of us. It is the gift of love with sacrifice. If we have put self out for others in big or small ways, or have cried for another's woes or laughed for another's joy, or held a hand in sympathy or just listened when there were no answers, we know the quality of this gift. In the Eucharist God is close in his creation, In Jesus we can recognise God near at hand. Pope Benedict writes -'we have to rediscover God, not just any God, but the God that has a human face, because when we see Jesus Christ we see God'.

## A View into the Future—Be Prepared!

Recently the Bishop of Clogher Larry Duffy commissioned the first 30 lay funeral ministers for the diocese, telling the congregation at Holy Cross Church, Lisnaskea that baptism "calls us to serve in new ways".

The new lay ministers will accompany families and communities at times of bereavement and loss and will lead some parts of funeral liturgies.

One of the lay ministers commissioned said they are authorised to officiate at various stages of the funeral rites, including ceremonies at the deceased's residence, receiving remains at the church, conducting services in crematoriums, and offering solace and prayers at gravesides.

The new ministers underwent "thorough training and formation", provided under the guidance of Bishop Duffy.
