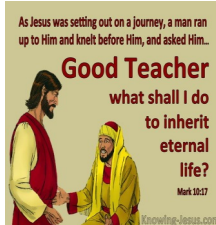

Catholic Bishops' Pastoral Letter Welcoming migrants to Ireland

On Sunday 13th October, the Bishops of Ireland published a pastoral letter to welcome migrants to Ireland. As Christians, we have a responsibility to respond to the key question of immigration across our island, and the world. The fundamental question asks: "Who is my neighbour?", and to answer this we are informed by the parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk. 10:29—37). In the light of the Gospel and Catholic Social teaching, our bishops offer this reflection on what hospitality for migrant people means in contemporary Ireland.
