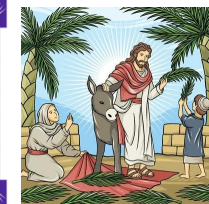

Arrangements for Holy Week 2023

This year again, we follow the same outline as last Easter and I ask all parishioners to treat the ceremonies as a parish celebration and not as two distinct areas. Think along the lines of 'Fr. Manning Gaels' a united family where Christ is at the heart of all our celebrations. The ceremonies are as follows:

Holy Thursday:

7 p.m. : Mass of Last Supper in St. Patrick's Ballinamuck
8 p.m.: Mass of Last Supper in St. Mary's Drumlish followed by Adoration until 11 a.m.

Good Friday:

3 p.m. Celebration of the Passion & Veneration of the Cross in parish church St. Mary's Drumlish
6 p.m.: Stations of the Cross in Drumlish starting at the Church and ending at the new cemetery. The various parish organisations are invited take part in carrying the large Cross from station to station.

Easter Vigil:

8 p.m. Mass in parish church St. Mary's Drumlish

Easter Sunday:

9.30 am: St. Patrick's Ballinamuck
11.00 am: St. Mary's Drumlish

Guide to Holy Week



Palm Sunday

Sunday before Easter. Celebration of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Observed with palm branches, parades, and celebration.



Maundy Thursday

Thursday before Easter. Commemorates the Last Supper. Often observed with foot washing, stripping of the altar, and overnight prayer vigil to keep watch with Jesus in the garden.



Good Friday

Friday before Easter. Most solemn day of the church year. Observes the day Jesus was crucified. Observed by praying the Stations of the Cross and three hours of silent prayer while Jesus was on the cross.



Holy Saturday

Saturday before Easter. Observes the day Jesus was in the tomb. This is a day of somber reflection, reflecting on what we'd miss in a world without Jesus.



Easter Sunday

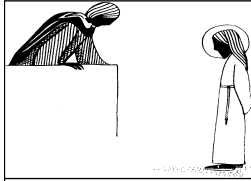
Hallelujah! Christ has risen! This day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Sing hallelujahs and celebrate with great joy.



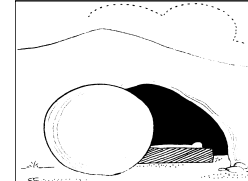

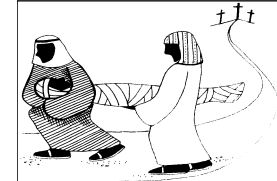
2. Jesus receives the Cross



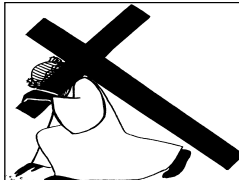
1. Jesus is Condemned to death



14. Jesus is laid in the Tomb

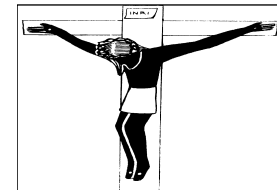


13. Jesus is given back to His Mother

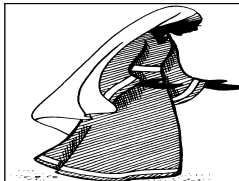


3. Jesus falls the first time

A devotional practice involving tracing Jesus' journey from the trial before Pilate to Calvary, first observed in all likelihood in the city of Jerusalem itself by processing from place to place, stopping at each point for reflection, silence and prayer. The devotion spread in the Middle Ages (largely through the Franciscans) to other churches where a series of fourteen images or small plain crosses marked the walls of the inside of the church. People would walk from station to station for prayer and reflection centered on the person(s) or place imaged in the station. Indulgences are attached to observing this devotion.

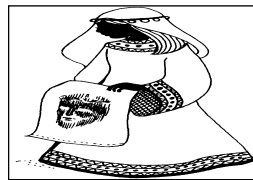
The selection of the fourteen stations was likely not finally settled until the eighteenth century. The Stations observed are: Jesus is condemned, Jesus carries His cross, Jesus falls the first time, Jesus meets His Mother, Simon of Cyrene helps carry the cross, Veronica wipes Jesus' face, Jesus falls a second time, Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem, Jesus falls the third time, Jesus is stripped of His garments, Jesus is nailed to the cross, Jesus dies on the cross, His body is taken down from cross, and His body is laid in the tomb.



11. Jesus is nailed to the Cross



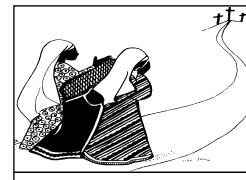
5. Simon helps Jesus carry His Cross



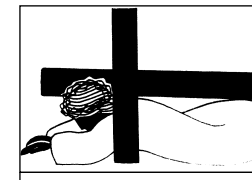
6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus



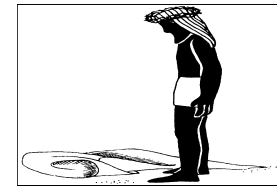
